Executive Director Report







I am pleased to present the 2023 annual report for the United Way of South Central Massachusetts (UWSCM). This year marks significant milestones, including our 85th anniversary and the continued dedication of our staff, volunteers, and donors in addressing critical community needs.

Our annual campaign exceeded its goal, raising over \$600,000 locally to support local partner programs. This collective effort ensures critical services reach those who need them most. We strategically allocated funds through a rigorous grant application process, focusing on three core areas:

Education: We awarded grants to initiatives promoting early childhood education, academic success, and career readiness.

Health: Programs funded addressed mental health support and healthy living initiatives.

Financial Stability: Grants supported essential needs assistance, shelter programs, and literacy education.

We had many additional accomplishments in 2023 that have impacted the communities we serve in more ways than ever before. The Town of Southbridge requested that the UWSCM administer \$75,000 of ARPA funds to support the homeless and residents in need of rental and utility assistance. Another special grant from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts allowed for expansion of after school programs and out of school time programs for students in pre-K - 12th grade. Severe weather devasted some local farms and throughout Massachusetts. A special fundraising effort was made in conjunction with the United Way of Central MA to create the MA Farm Resiliency Fund and two local farms received financial assistance to overcome their loss of crops. Day of Caring saw over 125 volunteers tackle 13 projects in South Central MA. And the most exciting event was our 85th Anniversary celebration held on March 29, 2023, at Samuel Slaters in Webster. It was a wonderful event honoring many donors, companies and individuals who have made significant impact to this United Way.

While we celebrate our achievements in 2023, we acknowledge the ongoing challenges faced by our community. Rising costs and economic uncertainties necessitate continued focus on supporting vulnerable populations.

In 2024, UWSCM will:

- Continue our pursuit to address housing instability, access to affordable early
 education, opportunities for education success, mental and physical health programs
 that improve an individual's outcomes, and access to programs that will increase the
 ability to reach financial stability.
- Foster deeper collaboration with local businesses and organizations to leverage combined resources.
- Launch innovative fundraising campaigns to reach new donor bases.

The unwavering support of our community is the cornerstone of UWSCM's success. Through the collective efforts of our staff, volunteers, and donors, we remain committed to making a lasting difference in the lives of individuals and families throughout South Central Massachusetts.

Board President's Report

Our 2022-23 year was a busy year with many challenges as our organization continued to grow, along with the growth of needs in our community. As we began our 85th year in a difficult economy, there was concern about how we would achieve our campaign goal. We had allocated the highest amount ever to our member agencies, thus requiring a higher goal than we had ever had. However, our initial worries about the success of the campaign were for not. With the help of foundations such as the Fels Foundation and Mapfre Foundation, excellent workplace campaigns that saw significant increases in employee donations and company matches, and some generous donors in our 5 towns, we exceeded our goal and raised over \$600,000 to support our partner agencies' programs. With this financial goal achieved thanks to the help of our donors, the UWSCM was able to support programs that improved lives for many in our community, as we have been doing for the past 85 years.

With 2 years behind us since the merger of the 5 towns of Charlton, Dudley, Southbridge, Sturbridge, and Webster, one of the important focus areas for the Board was on the needs of the organization for the next 3 years. The Board created a committee to develop a strategic plan that addressed the organizational needs to be able to provide the best support to our community. The plan addressed staffing, competitiveness, infrastructure needs, development, fund raising, and marketing. Initiatives that help to achieve our mission/vision as a collaborator focusing on health, education, and financial stability were also highlighted. Over the past months the Board and Executive Director have been working on implementing many of the actions identified in the strategic plan to strengthen the organization and prepare the UWSCM to be ready for the future challenges and needs of the community.

With the continued support of our donors and the forward thinking of our Board and staff, I am confident that the UWSCM is in a strong position to remain committed to our mission and make a measurable difference in addressing the needs in our 5 towns.

Finance Committee Report





2022-23 Community Investment Committee

The United Way of South Central Massachusetts (UWSCM) 2022-2023 campaign was an exciting year as it also coincided with our 85th Anniversary. The Finance Committee is focused on maintaining financial transparency, accountability, and maximization of our overall impact to the community. In order to meet the needs of our community, we set an ambitious goal of \$584,000 for our organization. I'm proud to announce that we were able to not only meet but exceed this goal by raising over \$615,000! In addition to this, we managed and allocated more than \$298,000 to local school districts and local after school and out of school programs. At the close of our fiscal year, the UWSCM remains in a financially strong position. Assets increased by nearly 11% to a total of \$1,077,000, while our liabilities remained relatively flat at \$56,000. With the continued generosity of our donors and volunteers, the UWSCM is in a great position to continue serving our community for many years beyond this 85th milestone.

While financial stability is of the utmost importance, evaluating and deciding how much we have to donate and to whom we allocate our funds too is equally important. The Community Investment Committee (CIC) is the group tasked with this responsibility. This dedicated group of volunteers are responsible for allocating UWSCM to those local 501 3C agencies who need financial support. Over a two-day period, the CIC interviewed, debated, and allocated \$435,000 to 21 different agencies. In the end, the CIC was confident these funds will be directed to those organizations who address the needs of the most vulnerable in our community.

The need for basic services only increases each and every year. Budgets are stretched impossibly thin as people and organizations try to stave off the rising costs for all goods and services. Inflation has only exasperated the problem, making the importance of the United Way today even more critical than it has ever been. We ask that you continue to support the UWSCM with your financial gifts and volunteerism so that we may continue to make impactful changes to the community we all call home.
